Robbie Fairchild began dancing at the age of four in Salt Lake City. He continued his training at the School of American Ballet at the age of fifteen then joined the New York City Ballet in 2005 and quickly rose to the rank of principal dancer. Robbie made his Broadway debut as Jerry Mulligan in the Tony Award-winning musical *An American In Paris*. He was nominated for the Tony Award for Best Performance by An Actor in a Leading Role in a Musical, and won the 2015 Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle Awards for Outstanding Actor in a Musical, the 2015 Astaire Award for Best Male Dancer, and the 2015 Theatre World Award. He was also nominated for the 2015 Drama League Award for Distinguished Performance. He went on to

perform at the Hollywood Bowl in *A Chorus Line*, Royal Albert Hall in *Oklahoma!*, and *Kiss Me*, *Kate* for New York's Roundabout Theater Company. Late last fall, he was the dancer/choreographer for Mary Shelley's *Frankenstein* off-Broadway and starred in the NY City Center Encores! Production of *Brigadoon*. TV credits include: Julie's Greenroom on Netflix, Romeo in NYCB's Romeo and Juliet and Carousel Boy in NY Philharmonic's Carousel, both for PBS; Live From Lincoln Center, Dancing With The Stars, The Late Show with Stephen Colbert, Live with Kelly and Michael, CBS <u>Sunday Morning</u>, 60 Minutes, Film: Cats and NY Export: Opus Jazz

Jess LeProtto is a New Jersey native and Broadway performer, who holds a B.F.A. Musical Theater at Pace University. Broadway credits include: A Beautiful Noise: The Neil Diamond Musical, Carousel, Hello, Dolly!, Cats (Mungojerrie), On The Town, Newsies (OBC), Bye Bye Birdie, How the Grinch Stole Christmas!, and The Boy From Oz. National Tours/Regional Theater include: Hello, Dolly! (Barnaby Tucker), Radio City Christmas Spectacular (Grand Ole Opry), American Dance Machine for the 21st Century (Joyce Theater), A Bronx Tale (Papermill Playhouse), In Your Arms (Old Globe Theater), Freddie Falls in Love (Signature Theater).



Amar Ramasar was born in the Bronx, New York, and began his studies at the School of American Ballet (SAB) in 1993. In addition, he studied at the American Ballet Theatre Summer Program and The Rock School of Pennsylvania Ballet. Mr. Ramasar became an apprentice with New York City Ballet in 2000 and joined the Company as a member of the Corps de Ballet the following year. He was promoted to Soloist in 2006 and then to Principal Dancer in 2009. At NYCB, Mr. Ramasar has featured numerous works by George Balanchine, including Agon, Divertimento No. 15, The Four Temperaments, George Balanchine's The NutcrackerTM. He was

also prominently featured in works choreographed by Jerome Robbins, Benjamin Millepied, and Christopher Wheeldon. Mr. Ramasar also originated several roles in works by Peter Martins, Mauro Bigonzetti, Wayne McGregor, Benjamin Millepied, Justin Peck, Alexei Ratmansky, and others. Mr. Ramasar was a recipient of the Bessie Award for Outstanding Performer in 2015 and a Mae L. Wien Award recipient for 2000. Ramasar additionally works collaboratively with many international choreographers. In 2018, Ramasar played Jigger Craigin, one of the lead roles in the revival of Rogers and Hammerstein's Carousel on Broadway. He performed the Tony award-winning choreography live for the 72nd annual Tony Awards at Radio City Music Hall in New York City. In 2019, Ramasar was named Principal guest artist with the Teatro dell Opera di Roma and originated the role of Don José in its brand new, full-length production of Carmen, choreographed by Jiří Bubeníček. Mr.Ramasar starred as Bernardo in the 2020 revival of *West Side Story* on Broadway.



Christine Sienicki was born and raised in New Jersey where she started dancing at the age of 6. Christine attended Rutgers University while pursuing her dance career. Balancing school and dance, Christine was cast in her first professional job in the Super Bowl Halftime Show at the age of 18. Later that year, she performed as a Rockette in the *Radio City Christmas Spectacular* and has been a part of the show ever since.

Christine has since appeared in many exciting television shows, movies, commercials and award shows which include, The Marvelous Mrs Maisel, Feud, Marvel's Jessica Jones, Fosse/Verdon on FX, Madame Secretary, Saturday Night Live, the MTV Music Awards, The Tony Awards, The Late Show with Stephen Colbert, the NBA All Star game, Dancing With the Stars, Project Runway, America's Got Talent, Late Night with Jimmy Fallon, The Oprah Winfrey Show, The Ellen De Generes Show, Last Week Tonight with John Oliver. Christine appeared on "Dick Clark's New Year's Rockin Eve" with former Mayor Bloomberg and as a special guest for both President Obama and President Bush at the White House. She can also be seen in movies such as, "Tick Tick Boom", "Better Nate Than Ever", "Isn't it Romantic", "The Kitchen", "A Holiday Spectacular" and "New Year's Eve" along with multiple commercials for brands such as Kate Spade and Carioca Cafè. As a model she has appeared in magazines such as Vanity Fair, Esquire, FHM UK, Boston Magazine, Dance Magazine, Dance Spirit Magazine, BELLA NYC, Food Network Magazine, David Barton Gyms, Time Out Magazine and many more. She can be seen in ads for Kate Spade, So Danca and in Degree deodorant ads for, "So You Think You Can Dance," as well. Robert La Fosse danced with American Ballet Theatre and New York City Ballet as a Principal Dancer. Throughout his career, he performed in works by Jerome Robbins, George Balanchine, Agnes de Mille, Bob Fosse and Twyla Tharp. He also starred in the Broadway productions of *Bob Fosse's Dancin'* and *Jerome Robbins' Broadway*, for which he received a Tony Award nomination for Best Actor. As a choreographer, he has created over 100 works for ballet, opera, musical theater, film and television. He currently teaches at American Ballet Theatre's Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School. Robert La Fosse was invited by Jerome Robbins to join the New York City Ballet in 1986 as a principal dancer after a nine-year career with American Ballet

Theatre where he danced leading roles in many of the full-length classics. In addition to his performing career, Mr. La Fosse is also an established choreographer who has created over 100 works for ballet, opera, musical theater, film and television. He currently teaches at American Ballet Theatre's Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School. Robert La Fosse performed with American Ballet Theatre as a principal dancer for six years. In 1986, he was invited by Jerome Robbins to join the New York City Ballet as a principal dancer. Throughout his career he has danced leading roles in many of the full-length classical ballets, including the U.S. premiere of Sir Kenneth MacMillan's Romeo and Juliet. He has performed in works created by many choreographers including George Balanchine, Jerome Robbins, Anthony Tudor, Merce Cunningham, Sir Kenneth MacMillian, Sir Frederick Ashton, Twyla Tharp, and Paul Taylor. Mr. La Fosse has also starred in the Broadway productions of Bob Fosse's Dancin' and in Jerome Robbins' Broadway, for which he received a Tony Award nomination for Best Actor. Some of his television appearances include: 'American Ballet Theatre in San Francisco', Twyla Tharp's Push Comes to Shove, and the 'Live From Lincoln Center' telecast of 'Ray Charles in concert with the New York City Ballet'. He appeared as Dr. Stahlbaum in the film version of George Balanchine's The Nutcracker. In addition to performing, Mr. La Fosse is also a choreographer. He has created over 100 works for Ballet, Broadway, Opera, Film and Television. The New York City Ballet has performed 10 of his ballets. In 1987 he wrote his autobiography entitled "Nothing to Hide." He currently teaches at American Ballet Theatre's Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School.

Tommy Scrivens graduated from The Ohio State University with a BFA in dance performance. Tommy is a dance artist and educator with American Dance Machine for the 21st Century, and has recently been name an inaugural Legacy Teacher for ADM21. Tommy is also a Protégé' with the Verdon Fosse Legacy and he appeared in the FX TV show Fosse/Verdon. Tommy has performed with Columbus Dance Theater

Contemporary Ballet Company, in the United Kingdom tour of Tap Fusion, as a guest artist with BalletMet, Columbus, Collide, and Parsons Dance. Tommy has been privileged to teach at Peridance, Broadway Dance Center, Steps On Broadway, The Ohio State University, Adelphi University, Manhattanville College, Marymount Manhattan College and many dance studios across the nation. Tommy has been an assistant choreographer for shows such as Motown the Musical, the Miss Florida Pageant and the NYMF festival. Most recently, he assisted the director and choreographer for the North Shore's Smokey Joe's Cafe and the 2022 Jimmy awards and was movement director for the original play The SupaDupa Kid at Barrington Stages. Tommy is an adjunct professor at Marymount Manhattan's Musical Theatre Program.



Pamela Sousa was a player in the original Bob Fosse production of *Pippin*. She is pleased to pass on her knowledge of Fosse's incredible choreography. Even after 50 years the nuances and intent are still very clear to her. Other highlights of Ms. Sousa's performing career include *Chicago* (1975), *Can Can, A Chorus Line, The Loves of Anatol*, and *Stepping Out*. As a choreographer her credits include the Broadway productions of *Romance, Romance* and *A Grand Night For Singing*. Off-Broadway are *Olympus on My Mind* and the 92nd Street Y's **Lyrics & Lyricists**.



Nikki Feirt Atkins, Founder and Producing Artistic Director is a former dancer and an M.D. Nikki studied ballet as a scholarship student at New Jersey Ballet and the Joffrey Ballet School in New York. In addition, she studied Graham, Horton, East Indian dance (Bharatanatyam), jazz with Matt Mattox, Luigi and Betsy Haug with whom she performed. Of note, Nikki studied with Lee Theodore, founder of the original American Dance Machine, who had a profound influence on Nikki. After a brief career as a professional dancer, Nikki went on to obtain her B.A. Magna Cum Laude in biology and performing arts at New York University. She subsequently earned her M.D., completed her residency and fellowships at New York Presbyterian Hospital/Cornell and Columbia and became a practicing pathologist and researcher at Columbia University Medical Center. While subsequently working as a part-time pathologist in private practice, Nikki became involved in several dance projects, including Director of New Artistic Programs at the Joffrey Ballet School in New York and working with director/choreographer Chet Walker on projects including The Jack Cole Project. In February 2012, Nikki founded American Dance Machine for the 21st Century, where she is currently Founder and Producing Artistic Director
